Democracy and the Rule of Law	Democracy forms the foundations of geographical understanding. It provides an opportunity for students to choose and make decisions about geographical issues and concepts. Through a justified approach, students consider why they have or have not chosen a specific argument and provide counter arguments to this. For example, they do this when explore the impacts of deforestation within the Amazon Rainforest.
The Rule of Law	The rule of law is addressed through students exploring the legal and ethical consequences of peoples' choices. For example, students discuss this when exploring the impacts of tourism, changes in climate and managing the impacts to fragile ecosystems.
Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs	A culture of mutual respect is created through discussion and reviewing differing points of view. This allows for development of tolerance for those of different beliefs which is integrated as students explore contrasting countries and impacts of migration.
