



<b>British Value</b>	<b>Psychology</b>
<b>Democracy</b>	The first module taught in Psychology is Social Influence. This takes in to account the Psychological processes behind particular movements within British society, where we examine how a democracy changed society for the better.
<b>The rule of law</b>	Within Psychology, students examine the psychological processes behind why the law is followed. Students examine the difference in behaviour when individuals are held to account in the law and the influence of social roles in society.
<b>Individual liberty</b>	The British Psychological Society states strict Ethical Guidelines, including informed consent and right to withdraw from research. Students not only learn about these factors but this is promoted within the classroom as they have the right to withdraw from research undertaken in class.
<b>Mutual respect for and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs and for those without faith</b>	The majority of lessons encourage students to explore a range of beliefs, theories, and cultures, which offer explanations for human behaviour. Pupils also reflect on their own beliefs on moral and ethical issues during discussion and structured debates.
